

Freelance part-time job opportunity for native speakers of SLOVENE

Street addresses aren't accurate enough to specify precise locations, such as building entrances, and don't exist for parks and many rural areas. This makes it hard to find places and prevents people from describing exactly where help is needed in an emergency.

what3words has given every 3m square on the planet an address of 3 random words – for example, our London office is located at [///filled.count.soap](https://filled.count.soap). what3words addresses are more accurate than street addresses or postcodes, but easy to remember and communicate. We are currently working to launch a **Slovene** version of our product, so that every 3m square across the globe will have a unique what3words address in your language. The job focuses on:

- 1) making sure that the **best**, most **common** words in your language are used, and
- 2) making sure that **no unsuitable** words appear in the what3words addresses.

No specific qualifications are required, although you must be a native speaker of the language and be confident in your writing and spelling skills! It is helpful if you are passionate about language and/or technology, and you must be able to communicate confidently in English.

You will also be asked to upload a copy of your CV.

Work: Freelance from home (computer and internet access needed).

Compensation & Duration: there will be around 3 hours of training, for which we will pay you a flat rate of **50 EUR total** (or local equivalent). This can be done in your own time over three weeks. If successful with the training, you will be offered further part-time work for around 3 months, around 5-10 hours a week. This further work is paid at **17 EUR per hour** (or local equivalent).

The deadline for applying to the role is **Thursday 13 October**, and successful candidates will start the project on **Monday 17 October**.
